




As stocks plunged last week, investors focused on the risk of recession and another market collapse.

Richard Sylla sees something very different over the longer term: the muchlonger term.




A Better Future?

NYU Prof. Richard Sylla, who accurately forecast the market weakness of the past decade, thinks things will get better in the next decade.









30-Year Rolling Real Stock Returns









Long-Run Trends in Long-Maturity Real Rates, 1311–2022
